Dear Dr. Phyps,

I purchased this property in 1967, which is reasonably close to the home of my maternal grand parents in the Rhandola. It is the highest of a group of five farms near summer of the Mynaged Llandlani, bying on the southern slope stretching down to the Towy valley.

The mountain is covered by Brance Age archaeological relies, and is a special landscape area overlooking the Teifi Valley. Next month a wind turbine company will be appealing against the planning refusal of the Carmarthenshire County Council for Mem to be desired the skyline of Mynydd Manllumi. The area is visible from the Camarthen-Abenstius the resolvey line.

When I first came here the trackand stations were all intect and I saw a good train 5MM ourning, while local residents were trying to prevent the closure planned by Dr. Beaching, who had no Welshinterests. Had the Welsh Assembly been set up by then, it might have been able to save the line, which Christian Wolmer described in his book on the history of rail ways in the United Kingdom as a 'secondary main line'.

The proposal by the ATM Mrs Joyce Watson to respen the line is absolutely brilliant. It would be the most powerful investment in West Wales using the legacy of the Victorian crivil engineering to improve the speed of travel (from lembrokeshire via Carmarthen and through the Teifi Valley to Aberystwyth, and onwards via the Cambrin Coast line to Snowdonia). Scotland is reopening the line from Edvirbroght to the Borders; even England is now reopening lines closed down by Dr. Beeching. Wales has already been reopening lines in the Valleys, hast year I saw stations being rebuilt there, when Armia Trains were doughtly the German Railway Congrany (who would support they proposal, pechaps with capital investment).

Please reopen The Carmathan-Aberystwyth line to link South and North Wales without borning to make a long detour into England to make such a joinney. The presence of the Civili Railway should not create a problem. The Northyork Moors Railway uses the Network Rail line to Whithy formits northern terminus. With hanks, yours sincerely,
