Actions

Members of the cross party group discussed the issues raised in the presentation and responded to the following questions at the end of the presentation:

What works well?

- CAMHS has a funded outreach service role within S.Wales and has an element of training attached to this to raise the standards of those working within CAMHS eating disorder services
- Data collection at tier 3 and measuring positive outcomes

What does/would a good service look like?

- GP referral for urgent cases into CAMHS within one week
- GPs need further training around Eating Disorders to be able to confidently refer patients into CAMHS and Adult services. Some GPs are ambivalent about presentation of ED and need upskilling to recognise an ED
- Have a framework structure which is consistent through all services and tiers
- Have a family therapist working within eating disorder teams
- Measuring outcomes in collaboration with service users

What would be your priorities?

- Review the Eating Disorders Framework for Wales
- Raise the profile of eating disorders in general mental health policy
- Improve attitudes and reduce stigma

Early intervention: primary care and education

- Improve health professionals' awareness and knowledge of eating disorders in primary care and generic community services
- Provide specialist training about eating disorders to GPs and other relevant primary care professionals.
- Improve information and support available to people with

experience of eating disorders and their family/carers.

- Improve the availability of appropriate and timely referrals
- Refresh the Eating Disorders Framework for Wales to incorporate the legal duties and services provided under Part 1 of the Mental Health (Wales) Measure.
- Improve clarity about referral routes from primary care.
- Improve the ability for GPs and Local Primary Mental Health Support Services to fast-track people with eating disorder and deliver timely interventions.
- Support volunteers such as Beat ambassadors to work with health partners to improve first responses to patients with eating disorders.
- Support more research to assess the difficulties and pressures facing primary care in providing information, treatment and support to people with experience of eating disorders.
- Reduce waiting times for treatment and support.
- Reduce the variation in treatment, support and waiting times across Wales.
- Improve evidence base about the effectiveness of different types of treatment and support.
- Deliver the most appropriate, evidence based interventions and improve outcomes for patients.
- Improve the evidence base about the effectiveness of early interventions.
- Improve information, awareness and support in schools for pupils and staff.
- Improve knowledge of referral routes for pupils with eating disorders.
- Support for Beat ambassadors to work with school to better equip teachers to support pupils with eating disorders
- Improve support for people leaving home to attend college/university, where they may move away from health professionals, family and support networks.
- Improve information, awareness and support in colleges and universities for students and staff.

Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services

- Improve inter-relationship between CAMHS and the Eating Disorders Framework for Wales.
- Provide specialist eating disorder training for CAMHS in order to upskill staff.
