Dear Ann,

During my attendance at the Children, Young People and Education Committee on 4 June, I agreed to write to set out further information on two particular points.

The Committee asked for details of initial plans for Children in Wales' participation project, and if any specific targets had been set. This information is set out in the Children in Wales Children and Families Delivery Grant delivery plan which I have enclosed at Annex 1 to this letter.

You asked whether the 'families with disabled children' element of the Families First budget is being used to provide play facilities for children with disabilities. I can confirm all Local Authorities in Wales have made use of these funds to enable children with disabilities to access play facilities. Details of the services offered by each Local Authority are included in the table enclosed at Annex 2. In many Local Authorities, children with disabilities may also access play facilities which have been commissioned through mainstream Families First funding.

You wrote to me on 12 June asking me to provide a written response to a number of questions suggested to the Committee by stakeholders, but which were not raised during the session due to time constraints. I will write to you on those points in due course.

## **Local Authority Provision: Disability Element of the Families First Programme**

Local Authority	Provision
Anglesey	Summer play scheme project
Blaenau Gwent	Access to play facilities is included in the services provided for disabled children.
Bridgend	After-school clubs, holiday play schemes and a Saturday club.
Caerphilly	Access to play facilities is included in the services provided for disabled children.
Cardiff	A two-week summer play and respite scheme for children and young people with multiple and profound physical and learning disabilities.
Carmarthenshire	Play schemes to provide short breaks for disabled children and their families in after school or play scheme settings.
Ceredigion	Access to specialised and mainstream play and recreation for disabled children. There is also a pre-school referral scheme for disabled children giving access to mainstream pre-school activities, which include play.
Conwy	Improved access to play and leisure for children with disabilities.
Denbighshire	Home and community based play development for disabled children.
Flintshire	Provision for family inclusion in mainstream activities for families with a disabled child.
Gwynedd	Provision of one to one individual support for children with disabilities to access play opportunities. Loan of POD play equipment to families.
Merthyr Tydfil	Provision of one to one support to children and young people who have disabilities and developmental delays to enable to access play activities after school and during holidays.
Monmouthshire	Provision to enable children with support needs to access local authority pre-school play provision and also play facilities in the summer holidays.

Neath Port Talbot	Early years play group and integrated play and recreational activities to enable disabled children to play alongside their peers
Newport	Serennu Children's Centre – providing a play and youth club for children and young people with disability or developmental difficulties aged 0 to 18 years.
Pembrokeshire	The Special Needs Assessment Playgroup provides playgroups for children with special needs, in an environment where their specific needs can be assessed by a multi-disciplinary team. Children are assessed through play, their needs identified, therapy and treatment provided and then integration into their own local playgroup assured.
Powys	Referral scheme to provide extra support to children with disabilities to access universal services such as out of school activities and holiday schemes.
Rhondda Cynon Taf	Services focus on young people who are disabled, vulnerable or at risk and aims to improve the health and well being of young people through the delivery of programmes which supports their access into physical activity and sport.
Swansea	Play facilities are provided for children with disabilities.
Torfaen	Play and short breaks service.
Vale of Glamorgan	Access to play facilities is included in the services provided for disabled children.
Wrexham	Access to play facilities is included in the services provided for disabled children.
